Barnes Ringers in Devon — Again

This was the sixth year that Colin Yandle had invited Barnes ringers and friends to his cottage near Bampton, and what with the 13 people in the cottage (it remains a mystery to me where they all sleep) plus some 9 others at the Exeter Inn and elsewhere, it was one of the best-attended yet. The pattern of quarters and general ringing has become well established over the years, and this year a number of cumulative landmarks were reached. On Friday, we scored our 50th different Devon tower (Yarnscombe) and our 100th different tower overall (Tawstock). Various other personal milestones can be gleaned from the quarters printed below.

For the first time, the "weekend" began on a Thursday, with the 9th of June seeing cars from all over London converging on Trowbridge. Here the small ringing chamber soon became rather crowded, with ringers spilling over onto (but luckil) not off) the church roof. There were half as many bells, but twice as much room, at Steeple Ashton, where this fine 20 cwt six were much enjoyed.

After lunch, the serious business began, with four quarters scheduled for the afternoon. Of these, only Marston Bigot was not a success, and this was due to the very late arrival of the key, rather than any performer errors. Highlights of the other quarters were the giant "duvet" on the ceiling at Edington (a much-needed form of sound control, since the bells hang directly above the ringing chamber); the petrol-mower in the tower at Wanstrow, the fumes from which nearly had half the band collapsing on the floor; and the TV film crew at Evercreech, who delayed the start of the quarter more than somewhat.

Friday was officially described as "a light dayl", but seasoned weekenders are never fooled by this sort of thing. With five quarter attempts, plus general ringing at Littleham, and two further local practices for the real head-bangers in the evening, it didn't seem that way to everyonel Centered around the Exmouth area, it was one of the most successful, with a quarter of Yorkshire Major at East Budleigh being the only failure of the day.

Perhaps this made us over-confident, for it is tempting to draw a discreet veil over most of Saturday's performances. Quarters at South Modition (Lincolnshire), Chittlehampton (Grandsire), High Bickington (8-Spliced), St Giles-in-the-Wood (Plain Bob Minor) and Great Torrington (Lincolnshire again) all failed for one reason or another. Also unsuccessful was an impromptu attempt of Plain Bob Minor on handbells in the car park of the Dartington Glass Factory, but judging by the number of packages coming out of the factory shop, this part of the day was generally felt to be a success! Also worth waiting for was the magnificent cream tea at Tawstock, which left even the most gannet-like ringers satisfied.

Fortunately, one of Saturday's two successful quarters was that of Grandsire Doubles at Yarnscombe, which was our host Colin's first quarter away from the tenor, at the first attempt. As if to prove that this was no fluke, he repeated the feat at Bampton prior to Matins the following morning. In another action replay, the handbell band lost Plain Bob again, in the annual "Sunday Morning on the Lawn at Broom Cottage" attempt.

After a salad lunch at the cottage, some people took the opportunity to join the local ringers at St Peter's Tiverton to ring for their D-Day Memorial Service. Others preferred for some reason to lie on the lawn in the sun drinking beer.

Following one final quarter at Wiveliscombe, and general ringing at Holcombe Rogus, the weekend ended as it had begun, with ringing on 12 bells, this time at St Mary Magdalene Taunton. This challenging ring used up any last vestiges of energy which anyone may have had left, but by being conservative in the methods rung, we did not disgrace ourselves.

So another weekend came to an end. Although the final total of 13 tower-bell quarters scored out of 20 attempted was not the best average we have managed, overall it was one of the most enjoyable with good company enjoying good weather and some fine bells. Many thanks to Colin for his hospitality, and to Eddie for the incredible feat of
