

Third Time Lucky – or Barnes make it to Lundy at last

During our annual visits to Devon last year and the year before we tried to make a day trip to Lundy but on both occasions we were weathered off. This year it was decided to make a separate dedicated trip and stay overnight on the island in the hope of guaranteeing success. The logistics of the ferry service and the accommodation booking restrictions eventually resulted in 12 of us making a booking for three nights early in April and crossing our fingers in the hope that the spring weather would be kind to us.

An advance party left London in spring sunshine on the morning of April 8th and had a leisurely trip down to Devon pausing after lunch for a quarter peal with some friends. We reached Bideford in time to check arrangements and find that the Lundy shore office were once again worried about an easterly force 3 blowing on the island!

However when we reached the quayside at 6.45am on the next morning the sea was almost like a mill pond and together with over 100 other passengers we were on our way by 8.15. On arrival at the island we made our way straight to the Marisco Tavern and then the Church. A quick quarter was chalked up before lunch and then, while some explored the island and went to find their accommodation, the rest of us began the serious ringing. By 5.00 pm two more quarters had been brought round and another had been a good near miss. The second day was scheduled to be peal day and a start was made at 10.00 am. Yorkshire went well for about an hour and a half before crashing and then the band adjourned for coffee in the sun on the veranda. Although disappointed at losing the peal, everyone was thoroughly enjoying themselves and the weather was perfect. It was about now that there began to be a more relaxed approach to our stay with walking, exploring and climbing taking up the rest of the day and most of the next. Totally uncharacteristicly for Barnes ringers it became difficult, nay in some cases impossible, to get them to the tower. An attempt was made to get back to our main business the following afternoon, but when you meet one short on an island three miles long and half a mile wide it is difficult to know where to start looking and after a few touches of minor that session was abandoned.

We had planned to take all our meals in the Marisco Tavern but now some changed to self catering and mouth watering menus were discussed, while others tried desperately to contact the North Light Tandoori! Penny enjoyed her brief period of residence in a castle and the social circle of some of the band was widened by encounters with a group from Exeter University who were on the island for the week and who seemed to set a pretty hard pace in the alcohol and party stakes. At least one of those in the band that met to ring London (it had been downgraded from spliced) on Saturday morning was struggling and after three attempts to get through the first lead, Cambridge was found to go much better! James White joined us for the day and the ringing continued until 3.00 pm and then, still in glorious weather, we boarded the Oldenburg for another mill-pond crossing.

For those who were having difficulty coping with only one tower in three days we were able to have a ring at Little Torrington courtesy Jonathan Eversleigh before switching off for the day. Sunday saw us ringing for morning service at Weare Gifford and then ringing a quarter at Taunton on the way home, to take our total to five

towers and eight quarters in five days. This does not seem revolutionary, but rarely has so much effort gone into organising a Barnes trip! However everybody thoroughly enjoyed all of it, even though we are now anxious to see the appointment of a new manager for the North Light Tandoori!

We are grateful to Bob Caton and Dave Snowden for all their help with the arrangements including the 7-tower standby programme set up in case we were weathered off again. Our thanks also go to all the others who helped, met, rang with us or just provided advice.
