CHRISTMAS, EPIPHANY



& CANDLEMAS PARISH COMMUNION

at St. Mary's Barnes

Whether you are a visitor for the first time or a regular at St Mary's, we warmly welcome you to this celebration of our Parish Communion.

On most Sundays there is separate provision for children aged 3-11 at the 10am Parish Communion in our Sunday Club and there is breakout space in The Retreat (room behind the organ).

Hearing aid/induction loop is in operation and accessed by switching your device to position 'T'.

Christmas – the Christmas season runs for the twelve days from Christmas Day to Epiphany. At the heart of this season is the celebration of the incarnation of Christ. The birth of Jesus marked on Christmas Day starts the cycle of seasons and festivals through which we celebrate his life on earth, culminating with his death and resurrection on Good Friday and Easter.





Epiphany – the word 'epiphany' comes from the Greek and means 'showing' or manifestation. In this season we explore the showing of who Christ was to the world through the revelation of Jesus Christ. Some of the main events in this are: the Magi (wise men) seeking Jesus, the declaration at Jesus' baptism and the demonstration of his power at the wedding at Cana.

Candlemas – otherwise known as 'the presentation of Christ at the Temple', marks the end of the 40 day Christmas/Epiphany season. Jesus is taken to the temple for the customary offerings and purification rites for his mother, and is recognised by Simeon and Anna as the promised Saviour – he who was to be the light of revelation to the gentiles and the glory of God's people Israel.

All: Amen.





Candlemas

It is indeed right and good, always and everywhere to give you thanks and praise through Jesus Christ who is one with you from all eternity. For on this day he appeared in the temple in substance of our flesh to come near to us in judgement. He searches the hearts of all your people and brings to light the image of your splendour. Your servant Simeon acclaimed him as the light to lighten the nations while Anna spoke of him to all who looked for your redemption. Destined for the falling and rising of many, he was lifted high on the cross and a sword of sorrow pierced his mother's heart when by his sacrifice he made our peace with you. And now we rejoice and glorify your name that we, too, have seen your salvation and join with angels and archangels in their unending hymn of praise:



Priest: Lord you are holy indeed, the source of all holiness;
Grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit,
And according to your holy will,
these gifts of bread and wine
may be to us
the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Who in the same night that he was betrayed took bread and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take, eat, this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

In the same way, after supper,
he took the cup and gave you thanks;
he gave it to them saying:
drink this, all of you;
this is my blood of the new covenant,
which is shed for you
and for many for the forgiveness of sins.
Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Priest: Great is the mystery of faith:

All: Christ has died;
Christ is risen:
Christ will come again.

Priest: And so, Father, calling to mind his death on the cross, his perfect sacrifice made once for the sins of the whole world; rejoicing in his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension and looking for his coming in glory, we celebrate this memorial of our redemption.

As we offer you this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, we bring before you this bread and this cup and we thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you.

Send the Holy Spirit on your people and gather into one in your kingdom all who share this one bread and one cup so that we, in the company of St. Mary and all your saints,

may praise and glorify you for ever, where the new creation is brought to perfection in Jesus Christ our Lord;

by whom and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours almighty Father, for ever and ever.

Priest: We break this bread


to share in the body of Christ.



The body of Christ. The blood of Christ.

The communicant replies each time: Amen.

Then together we say:

in baptism you have adopted us as your children, made us members of the body of Christ and chosen us as inheritors of your kingdom: we thank you that in this Eucharist you renew your promises within us, empower us by your Spirit to witness and to serve, and send us out as disciples of your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.
