Zimbabwe Link

The Kingston Area of our Diocese is linked with the Diocese of Matabeleland in Zimbabwe. The Diocese was founded in 1953 but the Anglican Church in the region was first founded in Southern Rhodesia in 1891.

In Matabeleland there are 35 churches covering a vast swathe of land from the city of Bulawayo in the south to Victoria Falls in the north west of the country. In addition to churches, the diocese has five schools which are important missional resources and play a key part in the life of the Diocese. The Diocese faces all the same sorts of challenges that the whole country faces: the effects of poverty and political turmoil. The removal of Robert Mugabe and the election of President Mnangagwa has yet to provide signs of any improvement in opportunities for Zimbabweans. Our Link with the Diocese is a sign to the Anglicans there that they are not forgotten. Our friendship and support enable the Diocese to continue its mission and ministry as it proclaims Gospel Good News amid many difficulties.

Richard's last Sunday

Today is the last Sunday for Richard as our Team Rector. At the 8am and 10am service, Richard will be preaching his valedictory sermons. The 6pm service is a Farewell to Richard at which the sermon will be by the Bishop of Kingston who will also commission Richard in his new role as Dean of St George's College Jerusalem. After the Farewell Service, there is a reception in Kitson Hall to which all are invited. If you have offered to bring food, you can drop this from 3.30-5.15pm at Kitson Hall or after that time to the Melvill Room at church.

New Peal Boards: Prior to the service the Bishop of Kingston will visit the tower to bless two new peal boards. These give details of two commemorative peals which were rung during Richard Sewell's incumbency. The inscriptions are:

In celebration of the Diamond Jubilee of HM The Queen **20th June 2015:** Rung to mark the 800th Anniversary of the Consecration of the newly enlarged church of St Mary, Barnes, by Archbishop Stephen Langton on his way back to London after the sealing of the Magna Carta on 15th June 1215
