Castelnau Community Centre

Last week the pewsheet listed the important activities for adults at the Centre. This week it is the turn of the children. Twice a week there is a parent and child stay and play session, offering children their first experiences of a structured play space, helping them to learn skills needed for nursery and primary school.

5-8 year olds get an opportunity to use the building independently of their parents at the weekly after school Community Kids Club, with its own team of three workers. Year 6 children get a weekly homework club, and the 11-18 age group have a twice weekly Youth Club. All these sessions help build supportive relationships with each other and the supervising workers, benefiting the community now and in the future.

Next Sunday, come and meet Simon Roach the Centre Director, who will attend our 10am service.

Bell Tower Land Drain: the North wall of the tower has been affected by rising damp for some time and some render has been removed to allow the wall to dry out. To eliminate the damp, a land drain will be dug alongside the outside facade of the North side of the tower, across the courtyard from the Melvill Room. Work will start on Tuesday 26th June and last about two weeks. Access to the Melvill Room will be disrupted for short periods, when users may be asked to approach it via the church. There will also be brief periods of noisy works, which will be done when the Melvill Room and church are not being used or at least when no one is being unduly disturbed.
