## St Mary's charities

One way to do this is to support the work of charities; and St Mary's has identified a small range of organisations with which we have a close association. We are asked to pray for them, those they benefit and the staff who lead the work. We are encouraged to volunteer our time in support of one or more of them. And we can offer our financial support for their work. It would be a sign of our commitment to bring the church in the world if each of us had a particular link with one or more of our charities. Our charities are:

Age UK Richmond's Barnes Green Centre, Castelnau Community Centre, Christian Aid, Christian Solidarity Worldwide, FiSH, Glass Door, Matabeleland Link, Richmond Welcare, and Under Tree Schools. Which do you support?

The service will be followed by a reception in Kitson Hall and all are welcome.
