This month's Charity: Christian Solidarity Worldwide

For more than 30 years Christian Solidarity Worldwide has mobilized people all over the world to call for religious freedom. They hold governments to account. They prevent torture and stop executions. They demand justice for those being punished for their faith – from pastors in prison to children excluded from education to young women who are abducted and forced to convert and marry.

They ask that people pray and write letters and cards to those who are in prison, under house arrest or being persecuted for their faith by using their Connect and Encourage booklet. The people they help consistently report that messages from CSW supporters keep them going in times of trial.

ANNUAL PAROCHIAL CHURCH MEETING

(APCM): The APCM will take place this year in church on Thursday, 26 April, at 8pm with drinks beforehand from 7.30pm. We shall be electing 2 churchwardens, 5 members of Deanery Synod and 5 people to our Parochial Church Council (PCC). This is the body which governs and guides the work of our church. Garden of Remembrance

The PCC wishes to continue the scheme of recording names on the stone paths, but the currently approved ones are now full. The relevant diocesan committee agrees we should extend the scheme to the path from the office door south eastwards. As required we have published the proposal for any comment, in the porch and lych gate; and we have now submitted it for diocesan legal approval. If approved, the scheme will require replacement of the current stones in that path later this year.
