# UNDER TREE SCHOOLS - giving girls a choice to have a career in South Sudan

The tenth year of teaching at our school started in April. Because of the insecurity and shortage of food some families have moved away and others keep their girls at home to help grow crops. So, the 350 girls of previous years is this year down to about 200 we understand. The girls get a cooked lunch every day (supplies from the World Food Programme, cooked by our four cooks). The school provides a monthly meal of meat. This is no doubt a real incentive to come to school. All our 20 teachers are still at the school, so the children get their academic teaching as well as sports, IT and sewing classes. The 9 non-teaching staff are responsible for the chapel work, as well as security and maintenance of the buildings. There is a herd of animals (a store of wealth to the Dinka tribe) which is producing young (11 calves in recent months) and therefore income to the school. The value the school places on investing in cattle gives it great esteem in the community.
