We will visit some of the small parishes in the north of the diocese which will enable us also to go to Victoria Falls. Following that, we will be taken to a variety of churches, schools and projects through the week. Zimbabwe continues to face a host of challenges. Thankfully the rains came bountifully so this year's crop has been splendid thus malnutrition is not a current problem. However politically the situation is still challenging and elections next year are a deep cause of concern. I will be able to return with a lot more information and stories about the joys and difficulties of our brothers and sisters and look forward to sharing them with you.
