Bishop's Certificate in Discipleship: Every year our Diocese runs a year-long course to help people to learn more about the Christian faith in a thorough and systematic way. It is called The Bishop's Certificate in Discipleship.

There are six modules:

- Exploring our identity and the Church
- Remembering the people of God in the Old Testament
- Following Jesus through the New Testament
- Understanding the teaching of the Church
- Focusing on mission ethics and lifestyle
- Responding to the Holy Spirit in prayer and worship.

Each of these is a five-week module running on weekday evenings or Saturdays. There is an introductory session on Saturday 16th September 10am – 1pm at Trinity House (London Bridge). If you are at all interested in this excellent course please speak to Rev'd Richard.
