UNDER TREE SCHOOLS – giving girls a choice to have a career in South Sudan One recent development at the school reflects the economic crisis. The teachers have started to cultivate an arable area, to provide food at the end of the rainy season in October, to supplement what they get from the school meals and from their families. Another development follows from money UTS sent the school to give them a special Christmas celebration. This brought the community to want to help the school. They decided to help make a wall topped by a fence round the school land for added security – something UTS had not been able to afford. Because building materials are incredibly expensive (see economic crisis again) they are making bricks. UTS has sent funds to provide food for the people helping, while they give their time for free. Finally, some secondary schools seem still to be operating, so 35 of the girls who have graduated from the UTS primary school are now in secondary education, with UTS bursaries to fund their fees.

Invitation to farewell service: All are invited to the farewell service for Rev'd Richard Sewell, Team Rector of Barnes, on Sunday 16th September at 6pm at St Mary's Church.
