## Under Tree Schools - education of girls in South Sudan

St Mary's has always been a major supporter of the girl's school in Malek Alel. We first knew of it when Rev'd Joseph Ayok was living with his family in our curate's house in Boileau Road. He had been with CMS, supporting exiles from the civil war between Sudan and what was to become South Sudan, the newest country in the world. He had been in the Sudan Olympic team in 1982, then exiled himself, as so many of his countrymen did. After polishing his English in Whitby (where he met Karin) he was ordained in Salisbury diocese. He had arranged for some classes for children, in an area of his home state. These were literally under the trees. If the fighting came close the teacher could pack up the school in his bag and lead the children somewhere that looked a bit safer. In 2005, the peace agreement with Sudan was signed, and Joseph could set up the school he really wanted. Just for girls, because they had no schooling at all, and by tradition got married at 14. To have a child at 15 is very dangerous for the mother and Joseph wanted girls to have the same career opportunities as boys. St Mary's helped him set up a charity. Ross, our last Rector, became a trustee and then Chair, Peter Boyling took on the role of administrator. St Mary's was generous in donating money to help build the school and the Friends of St Mary's made UTS a main beneficiary of the proceeds of the annual Barnes Charity Ball. A group of us made the journey out to the formal opening of the school in 2009. We have kept in close touch with developments since then. Will you help us keep up the tradition of St Mary's support for UTS? A small standing order would be of value in enabling us to help pay the running costs of the school. **Bishop's Certificate in Discipleship:** Every year our Diocese runs a year-long course to help people to learn more about the Christian faith in a thorough and systematic way. It is called The Bishop's Certificate in Discipleship.

There are six modules:

- Exploring our identity and the Church
- Remembering the people of God in the Old Testament
- Following Jesus through the New Testament
- Understanding the teaching of the Church
- Focusing on mission – ethics and lifestyle
- Responding to the Holy Spirit in prayer and worship.

Each of these is a five-week module running on weekday evenings or Saturdays. There is an introductory session on Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> September 10am – 1pm at Trinity House (London Bridge). If you are at all interested in this excellent course please speak to Rev'd Richard.
