## CHURCH OPEN DAILY FOR PRAYER AND REFLECTION

Welcome to St Mary's, whether you are joining us in the church or online.

If you are coming to the church, we will ask for your contact details if we don't already have them, in line with NHS Test and Trace regulations. Along with using the provided hand sanitiser and maintaining social distancing, **wearing a face covering** is now mandatory, unless you are exempt for medical reasons. Those leading services, including readings and prayers are not required to wear face coverings unless they are within 2 metres of others. The priest will wear a covering for the administration of Holy Communion. The church continues to be open 9am-5pm. You are asked to clean hands with the sanitizer at the entrance on arrival and departure. Please remember to social distance.

### Start of term and back to church!

We have two Sundays of particular celebration to look forward to in September. On **13th September**, we have our Patronal Festival Service at 10am, when we remember St Mary and give thanks annually for the life of our parish. This year I am pleased we will have as our guest preacher Rev'd Canon James Milne, who is the Canon Precentor at St Paul's Cathedral. St Paul's are patrons of this parish and James was at my licensing last July with the Dean David Ison.

On **20th September**, we will have a short all-age Eucharist at 10am to celebrate Harvest. We particularly invite families who may not have been back since lockdown. There will be reserved seating for larger family households. Our children's worker Jackie and our young people will be involved in leading. Please come with donations of food as symbols of all the good things God gives us. Preferably non-perishable, which we will then donate to the Foodbank. There will also be a "book bag blessing" - children are invited to bring their book bag, and adults to bring an equivalent for you which symbolises your work or other occupations!

### New zoom study group, starting 21st September

Our new group will look at some readings for the season of "creationtide". During September and October, the Church of England, encourages us to focus on God as creator and sustainer of all life. Each week we will look at a bible reading on this theme, and discuss it in a similar way to our recent groups on Acts and Philippians.

Our group will meet online at 2.30pm for an hour for 5 weekly sessions, from Monday 21st September to Monday 19th October inclusive. If you would like to join please let me know, and I will send you the zoom invitation a few days before. If you want to get ahead the full resources are on this link

### [Sleep Out to Give Others Shelter](#)

Glass Door Homeless Charity will be hosting its annual Sleep Out (or in) on 2nd October 2020. I'm planning to do it again in Duke of York Square, and I'm hoping others will join me this year, possibly including a group of our teenagers and Julie our youth worker. You'll see below there are different ways to join in this year.

For the first time this year, all participants will have the option to join the event remotely if they wish. But everyone will still be joining together as a Sleep Out community online.

Glass Door works to support and shelter those in our community who are at absolute crisis point. Glass Door welcomes everyone as a guest, giving them stability before helping them make the necessary steps to move off

the streets for good. The charity has remained open to help those facing homelessness throughout the pandemic and is committed to finding ways to ensure that individuals in need can find safe shelter and a warm welcome this winter and beyond. With a quarter of a million people at risk of losing their tenancy in coming months (according to Shelter), Glass Door's services will be needed more than ever over this next year. "The rise in homelessness is a scandal, and we will continue to do all we can to get people off the streets and into shelters. But we can't do it alone," says Rev Brian Leathard, chair of trustees at Glass Door and Rector at St Luke's and Christ Church, Chelsea. This year, there is one event, but many ways to get involved.

The choice is yours:

Option 1: Sleep In... your garden, car, own home on the floor, or anywhere that's creative but safe.

Option 2: Sleep Out... at Duke of York Square (Government guidelines and permission permitting).

Option 3: Sleep In... small socially distanced groups at a location of your choosing – e.g. in a friend's garden.

I will also assess if we could do a sleep out in the church grounds.
