Under Tree Schools - education of girls in South Sudan

You will have read in the papers that South Sudan is in a terrible situation. The newest country in the world is a failed state. Conflict between sectional interests, partly tribally based, has led to many thousands dead, over two million displaced and five million hungry to the point of near starvation. Inflation has made everything hugely expensive to buy, insecurity has prevented crops being planted. Salaries to teachers and other public servants are disrupted. Corruption is rife.

Fortunately our girls school is away from the main areas of insecurity. Food for the girls' daily hot meal is supplied by the UN. The teachers are staying loyal, despite everything. We can be very grateful that despite the chaos, the school is still operating, and feeding the staff and the girls.
