Zimbabwe Link

The Kingston Area of our Diocese is linked with the Diocese of Matabeleland in Zimbabwe. The Diocese was founded in 1953 but the Anglican Church in the region was first founded in Southern Rhodesia in 1891. In Matabeleland there are 35 churches covering a vast swathe of land from the city of Bulawayo in the south to Victoria Falls in the north west of the country. In addition to churches, the diocese has five schools which are important missional resources and play a key part in the life of the Diocese. The Diocese faces all the same sorts of challenges that the whole country faces: the effects of poverty and political turmoil. The removal of Robert Mugabe and the election of President Mnangagwa has yet to provide signs of any improvement in opportunities for Zimbabweans. Our Link with the Diocese is a sign to the Anglicans there that they are not forgotten. Our friendship and support enable the Diocese to continue its mission and ministry as it proclaims Gospel Good News amid many difficulties.

Next week will be the last Sunday for Richard as our Team Rector. At the 8am and 10am service, which is our Patronal Festival, Richard will be preaching his valedictory sermons. The 6pm service is a Farewell to Richard at which the sermon will be by the Bishop of Kingston who will also commission Richard in his new role as Dean of St George's College Jerusalem. After the Farewell Service, there is a reception in Kitson Hall to which all are invited.
